City seeking public input on new section of Paul Ambrose Trail for Health

HUNTINGTON – The City of Huntington is seeking the community's input on the location and design for a bicycle and pedestrian connection of the Paul Ambrose Trail for Health (PATH) along Washington Boulevard from Hal Greer Boulevard to Spring Hill Cemetery.

City officials will conduct a public meeting from 5 to 7 p.m. Thursday, Aug. 11, at Meadows Elementary School, 1601 Washington Blvd. During the meeting, city officials will share preliminary design options, discuss different types of bike and pedestrian amenities, show video simulations and accept written and verbal comments and feedback.

Consultants Burgess & Niple will work with the City of Huntington and West Virginia Division of Highways to design this new connection of PATH.
